1.0	Welcome to the meeting Cllr Phil Williams, in the Chair, welcomed the councillors to the June Meeting of Little Dewchurch Parish Council.		
2.0	Apologies for absence There were apologies for absence received from Cllr. Jo Hawthorne (JH) and Ward Cllr. David Davies (DD). Cllr Tom Price (TP) was not present.

5.0 To receive reports from 5.1) Ward Councillor

The Ward Councillor had sent his apologies. He was convalescing after being injured in a motorcycle accident.

Balfour Beatty

Information from Balfour Beatty had been circulated when received.

Reverend Mark Johnson

The Rev. Mark was present at the meeting. He had come to the meeting to update on the future of St David's Church in Little Dewchurch. He gave a resume on the benefice churches under his stewardship and there were seven open churches in his portfolio. There was only an average congregation of four people at Little Dewchurch and he explained that the option of closing the church was "not really on", however some changes would need to be made. The Church was still a part of village life and performing functions. The idea being proposed was to turn St David's Little Dewchurch into a "festival" church. This would mean a minimum of six services a year around festivals such as Christmas, Easter and Harvest. Llanwarne Church was already operating on this model. Little Dewchurch and Dinedor have a joint Parochial Church Council (PCC). The joint PCC would put forward a request formally to become a festival church from early 2026.

A conversation followed, with the parish council, about the condition of the churchyard. There were differing views on how the churchyard looked currently. It was felt that it was not as tidy as it could be and suggestions were made about working parties coming out, perhaps twice yearly, to return it to a good state? The digging of a trench on the land was commented and this should not have taken place and permission should have been sought. There were ideas to encourage ecumenical use of the church possibly by other faiths? I was also suggested that a working party should be set up to tiny up the headstones, cut overgrowth from around the graves and keep the churchyard tidy. Rev. Mark would liaise with interested groups to arrange working party dates. A map of the churchyard could be referred to so that the maintenance tasks could be rotated.

Rev. Mark said that he would keep the parish council informed of developments.

West Mercia Police and Golden Valley Bulletins Newsletters and information circulated when received. PC Martin Gillett was present at the parish council meeting. PC Gillett advised that there was nothing to report, specifically, this month. There had been some accidents and speeding was still an issue. There would be traffic calming measures implemented in the village in the next few months, hopefully. It was commented that drugs were being passed over in the church car park. PC Gillett said that he would look into this situation. He explained about the monitoring of "racing" in the ASDA car park in Hereford. The police were awaiting a letter from ASDA about their car park policy. Both PC Gillett and Rev. Mark left the meeting at 8.05 pm. 6.0 Finance and policies 6.1) Confirmation of bank balances The current account balance stood at £14294.55. 7.0 **7.1)** Play Area - update

Cllr Tatoiu advised that the playing field grass required cutting again. Cllr Tatoiu advised that he had removed the broken bench from the field, as had been agreed at the May Parish Council Meeting. Cllr Hawthorne had looked into a possible grant opportunity for a new bench and had reported that there was no availability identified, as at the date of the meeting. The parish council discussed the provision of a new bench(es) and Cllr da Cunha had some bench ends that may be suitable. He would send pictures of the ends to Cllr Lisle to see if suitable slats could be machined to suit the ends and create a new bench(es).

7.2) Roads and Footpaths

The road near to The Crickets was full of potholes and awaiting repairs. Church Lane potholes had been marked up for repair but had not been filled as at the date of the meeting.

7.3) Lengthsman - activities and funding

The Lengthsman was not present at the meeting.
The Chair would be speaking to the Lengthsman about tasks that were outstanding and about new work.
The dog zone required strimming.
